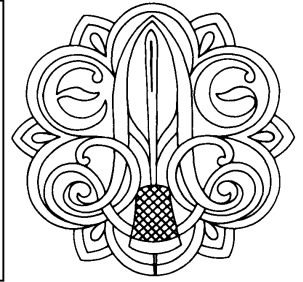

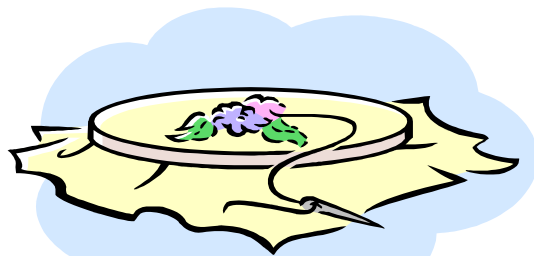

Fall Seminar: Our autumn class with Deborah Mitek will be ribbon ornaments. The class will be held at Way Public Library on November 10. Sign up for this class is complete.

Spring Seminar: Our first spring class will be April 6 with Carol Lynn Stratton. We will be stitching the *Herbarium* Sheet Mini. It is hardanger and blackwork. The cost for the kit is \$35.00. It will be held at the 577 Foundation and we will have a potluck for lunch. There is pre-work for this class. If you want to take the class, sign up as soon as possible as we will be discussing the pre-work at our January meeting.

The night before, April 5, we have invited Carol Lynn to give us presentation about judging and shows. She is an EGA certified judge. She has also led Fiber Forum and is currently the head of the Master Craftsman program in Counted Thread. There is a sign-up sheet for this, but no cost. We are looking for a place to have it now.

Ohio State Day: NAGT has signed up to host Ohio State Day on July 27, 2013. Marylyn Doyle and Jane Ellen Balzuweit will be designing a piece just for us. It will be held at Nazareth Hall in Grand Rapids, Ohio. We hope to keep the cost between \$50-60. This will include the teacher fee, hall rental, kit fee, lunch, all day beverage bar and snack..

Program Notes

November: The program will be Blocking Your Needlework, a part of the *Get it Finished* series. Irene Leonard will demonstrate how to lace your needlework, and Sue Wiemer will show how to wet or dry block your piece. This is information only, so you do not have to bring any supplies.

December: Christmas party; Ornament and Cookie Exchanges; New Officer Installation; Get It Finished entries, Wreath Opportunity Drawing. This year's theme is toys. Please bring your finished ornaments to the November meeting so Maria Nowicki can assemble the wreath.

January: pre-work for *Herbarium* Mini class in April. We will discuss how to work hardanger.

February: Designers Across America series. *Hearts by Four* by Peg Dunayer, led by Irene Leonard.

2013: We will be doing four *Designers Across America* series found in Needle Arts magazine. We are starting with the current project in the September 2012 issue. If you want to do the projects you must order them from EGA. The information to do this is on page 21. Individually the projects cost \$7.00. This one must be ordered by December 1, so order now. A yearly subscription is \$25 (4 projects). Several of us have completed the first project. It was fun and relatively quick. You can choose your own colors from your stash. The projects in the DAA series are usually smaller and will give us a variety of techniques for a reasonable price.

We will also be working the *Honeysuckle, Wisteria and Sweet Pea* crewel project by Canby Robertson that was in the June 2009 issue of Needle Arts. If you don't have this issue, you may download the directions from the EGA website. It is listed under Resources, NeedleArt Magazine, Free Articles, Projects & Techniques. This is not in the members only section so anyone may download and use the project. The stitches are basic. The fun part will be using the colors in a thoughtful manner. We will be assembling kits for this project and there will be a sign-up sheet and fee early next year. *Submitted by Caren Scarbrough.*

37th Annual Needlework Show Report

This year we had 30 stitchers (17 guild members) from Ohio, Michigan, Indiana, Pennsylvania, and Colorado enter 111 items and approximately 135 people came to see the exhibit. Most of them discovered the show while visiting the library, from word of mouth, and from newspapers. Our judge, Donna Halpin, awarded 12 first place, 15 second place, 17 third place and 19 honorable mention ribbons. Judge's Choice was awarded to *Dresden Garden*, stitched by Caren Scarbrough. Guild Choice went to Irene Leonard's Canvas piece, *Oh My Stars*. The Joyce Merrill Award went to Denise Waterfield's piece, *Little Red Dress*. Best in Show was Caren Scarbrough's Open Work piece, *About A Tree* and Popular Choice went to Pamela Lugulow's Cross-stitch piece, *Noelle*. The Triathlon Winner was Caren Scarbrough. Congratulations to everybody and thanks for making it another great show.

Heller Zeller had this to say about the show: I liked this year's judge, Donna Halpin. She said my House was extremely well stitched and my frame was perfect for my piece. Wow. I was also pleased to realize that my Surprise Bag of ten item netted Denise Waterfield ribbons for her "Little Red Dress." Do I have any more of those plastic doilies?

We are always looking for ways to improve our show. After some comments that made, the board decided to form a show committee to look at clarifying some categories, perhaps adding a new classification for Interpretation and formalizing some procedures. Members of the show committee are Irene Leonard, Diane Myers, Su Pellitieri and Caren Scarbrough. We will be looking at some of the guidelines and terms used by the EGA to help improve our show but if anyone has other suggestions, please let one of us know. The committee will report its findings back to the membership later in the year.

This has been a great project for us over the years. It is fun to see all of the clever stitching and the variety of ornaments within the theme. Below is a timeline of our ornament themes. When we decided on Toys this year, we also voted to do Mittens, next year. In October, Christine Hampshire reported that another group used a leaf outline shape, and everyone stitched the leaf with their choice of technique and fibers. All of the leaves were joined to form a wreath. The picture she saw of it was lovely. We could do this next year, and postpone the Mittens until the following year if we want. Christine will try to get us more information if we do.

Soldier Kissing Pillows

Sixteen members and past guild members assembled at Christine Hampshire's to assemble Soldier Kissing Pillows on October 25. She assigned us our jobs as we marked the pillow tops, sewed the tops and backing together, turned the pillows right side out, ironed, poked out the corners, stuffed, stitched closed the small opening and placed them in a plastic bag. We completed 41 pillows that day and have dozens more at various stages in the process of becoming a finished pillow. Many thanks to Christine and her husband David for having us at her home.

A very nice article about our outreach project appeared in the Bowling Green Sentinel-Tribune newspaper on Saturday, November 3, 2012. It described the project and gave information about EGA and our guild. Copies of the article will be available at our November meeting.

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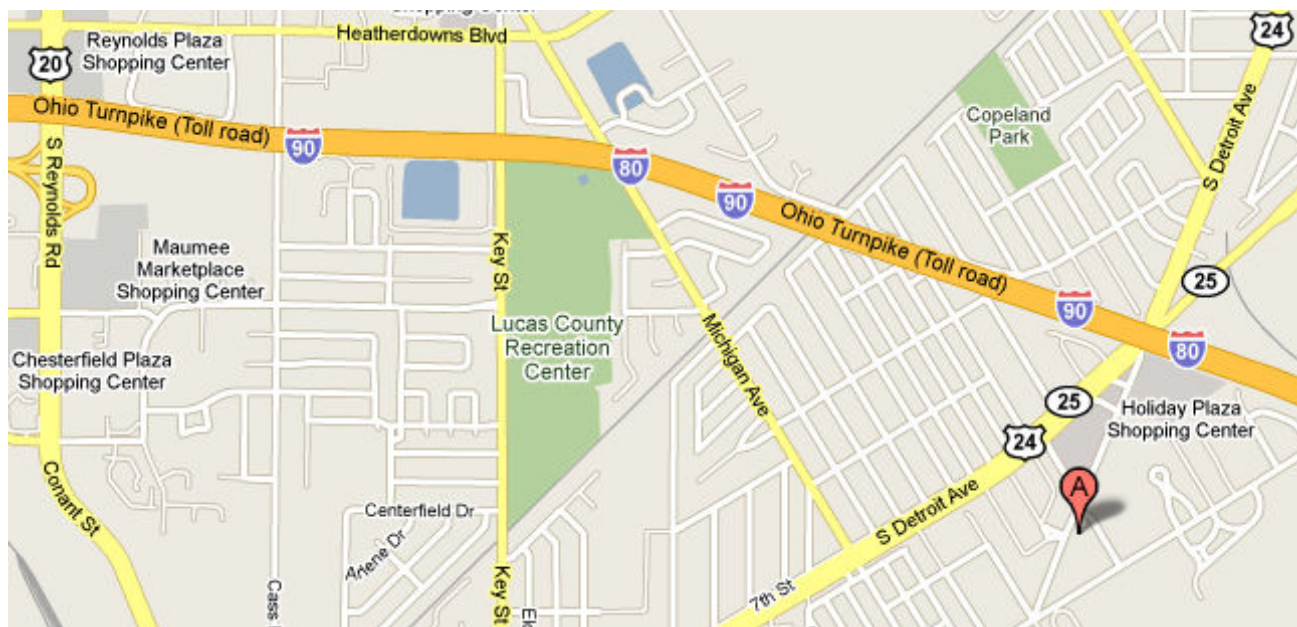
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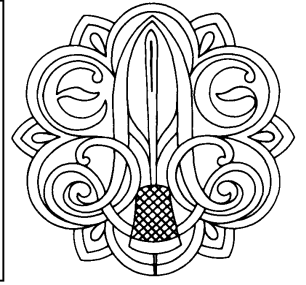
