From the President's Stitching Chair: Caren Scarbrough

Do you use other skills in your embroidery projects other than stabbing a piece of cloth with a needle? To start an embroidery I've seen paint or dye applied to the ground fabric to enhance the stitching. I've also seen paper, non-woven fabrics, leaves and fencing used as a "fabric". You can use a sewing machine to add stitches as well as using it in the finishing process. Woodworking provided a base for historic pieces as well as many beautiful accessories that we love to collect and use.

I've been using cartonnage skills with the box on the left. I adapted them to the practice box that came with our class "Home of the Bees" on the right. It worked out well and as soon as I get the embroidery finished I will put the box together with glue. I know many stitchers will react with horror at the thought of glueing anything to their embroidery. Japanese and French embroiderers have been using glue for centuries to set the back of their stitching. I've used hand stitching, machine stitching and glueing to finish many projects. What I pick depends on the desired look, the materials used and my mood at the time. What other skills have you used to enhance your embroidery?

Maria's Magical Orange-Pumpkin Cookies

- I. In a large mixing bowl beat butter and shortening with an electric mixer on medium to high for 30 seconds. Add the granulated sugar, brown sugar, baking power, and baking soda. Beat until combined, scraping sides of the bowl occasionally. Beat in orange peel, egg, and pumpkin. Beat in as much of the flour as you can with the mixer. Using a wooden spoon, stir in any remaining flour.
- 2. Drop dough by rounded teaspoon 2 inches apart onto an ungreased cookie sheet.
- 3. Bake in a 375 degree oven for 9-11 minutes or until tops are firm. Transfer cookies to a wire rack; cool. When cool, frost with Orange-Butter Frosting. If desired, garnish each frosted cookie with sugared, finely shredded orange peel. Makes 36 cookies.

Orange-Butter Frosting: In a medium mixing bowl beat 1/4 cup butter until fluffy. Gradually add 2 cups sifted powered sugar, beating well. Slowly beat in 3/4 teaspoon finely shredded orange peel and 2 tablespoons orange juice, if needed, to make frosting of spreading consistency.

1/2 cup butter, softened

1/2 cup shortening

1/2 cup granulated sugar

1/2 cup packed brown sugar

1/2 teaspoon baking powder

1/4 teaspoon baking soda

I teaspoon finely shredded orange peel

I egg


Icup canned pumpkin

2 cups all-purpose flour
