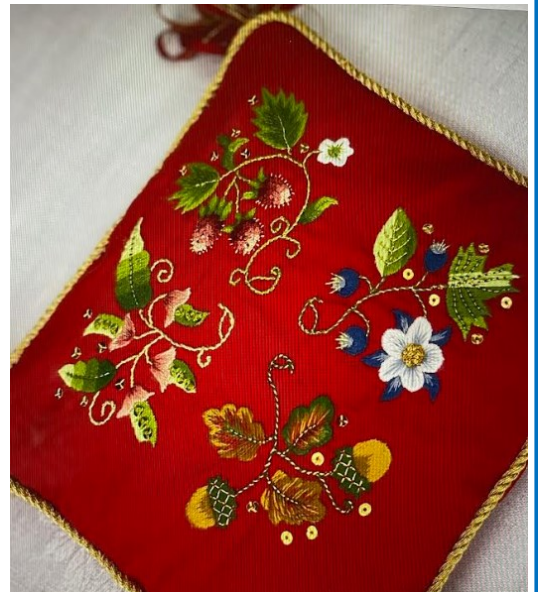

Are you a product stitcher or a process stitcher? Do you enjoy having a finished product to give to loved ones or keep for yourself? Or is it the actual stitching that makes you look forward to time in your stitching spot? You can be both and it will vary from project to project but we all find joy through stitching somehow.

NAGT will be having Kathy Andrews of The Unbroken Thread come to us in March, 2023 to provide us with stitching pleasure. She will teach the Trevelyan pincushion, a three day class using silk and metallic threads on silk fabric. This will be a lovely little project, but woe to the person who actually pokes a pin in your silk pincushion. It will also be an exciting stitching journey with many techniques to learn. Keep that in mind if you think the project is too hard for you. Classes are held to teach us something, not to practice what we already know. I find I learn something new in every class I take.

The details of the class have yet to be worked out, but the class will be 3 days. You can read more about it on Kathy's Website. We will also have a field trip to the Cleveland Museum of Art to see The Tudor exhibit. 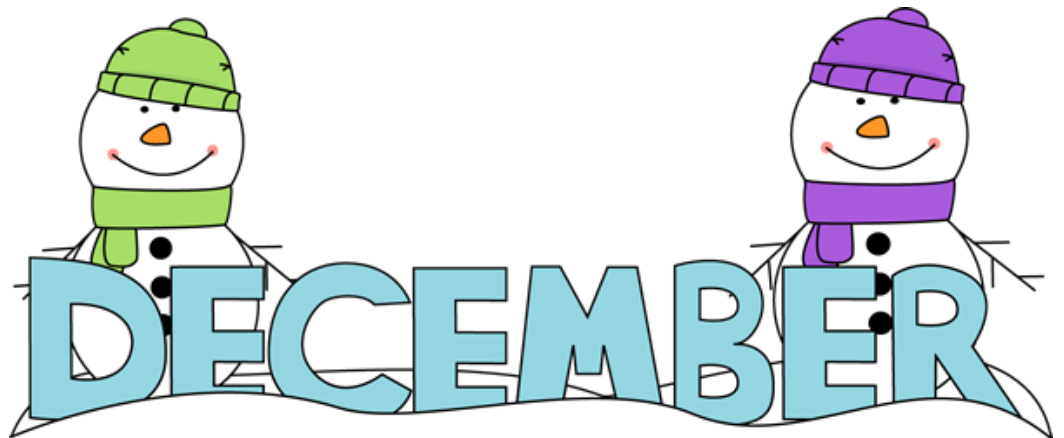

Peach Melba Punch

Step 1

Roughly chop 3 peaches. Place chopped peach and pineapple juice in a food processor. Process until smooth. Transfer to a sieve set over a bowl. Using the back of a spoon, press peach mixture through sieve. Discard solids

Step 2

Place 1/2 the raspberries in a bowl. Lightly crush with a fork. Thinly slice remaining peach.

Step 3

Place ice cubes in a 2-litre-capacity jug. Add peach slices and purée, and crushed and whole raspberries. Pour over lemonade. Using a large spoon, stir to combine. Top with mint. Serve.

4 yellow peaches

1 cup pineapple juice

250g raspberries

4 cups ice cubes

1.25 liters lemonade, chilled

Fresh mint sprigs, to serve

Sugared, finely shredded orange peel
