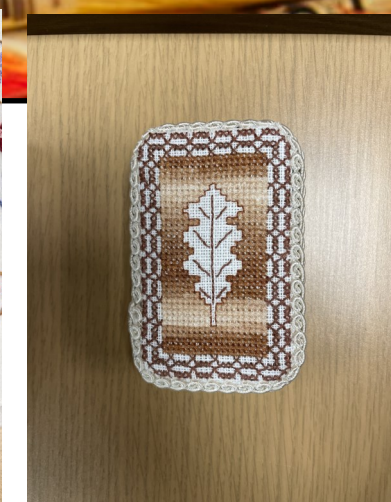

# Corn Casserole

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees.

In a bowl, mix all of the ingredients together and pour into a greased 8" x8" baking pan.
