Red Velvet Hot Chocolate

- I. Add the milk and cream to a large microwave-safe bowl or jug, and heat in I minute intervals until very hot to the touch (but not bubbling). Set aside.
- 2. Add the chocolates to a separate microwave-safe bowl and heat in 20 second intervals, stirring after each one, until melted and smooth.
- 3. Add the melted chocolate to the hot milk mixture, and whisk until combined. Whisk in the vanilla and enough red food coloring to reach your desired shade.
- 2 cups whole milk
- I cup heavy cream
- 1/2 cup milk chocolate, coarsely chopped
- 1/2 cup white chocolate, coarsely chopped
- I teaspoon vanilla extract
- Red food coloring
