Old Sampler: Diane Myers

If you follow Nancy Wright on fb, you know that she has moved to the mother-in law apartment which is attached to her house. The house is on three levels and the apartment is on one level so the move only makes sense. She calls it her memory house. She has been thoughtfully moving things from the house through the garage and into the apartment; but only things that have special meaning to her. Last week when I stopped in, she was talking about an old sampler she had stitched as a gift for her mom probably 50 years ago. It was showing its age and she wanted to refresh it. As we were talking, she started taking it out of the frame, a frame her husband had made. We were laughing because the backing was a piece of cardboard with pictures of race cars from her son's Hot Wheels collection (he's now almost 60). Her fear was that she had glued the sampler to a piece of cardboard. Luckily, she had not. She had instead used an office stapler to fasten it to a piece of corrugated cardboard! As we were talking, she removed the staples with a kitchen knife. She decided to wash it and later that day I received a text message, "the red didn't run!" After she ironed it face down on a towel, I picked it up, brought it home, and pinned it on to foam core and replaced it in its frame. As you see in the picture, the colors are bright again and the ground cloth is white again, just as it was when her mom received it 50 years ago.



Note: The product used to wash the sampler is called Vintage Textile Soak. You can find it online at VintageTextileSoak for \$11.49 for a 10 oz.bag plus S&H. Quilt Foundry in Maumee used to have it but call and check with them first. As you can see, it works amazingly well!
