Jennifer Simonic of Seattle, Washington and Masey Kaplan of Portland, Maine have started Loose Ends, a nonprofit that finds volunteers to complete all types of fiber arts projects including knitting, crocheting, sewing, quilting, embroidery, needlepoint, cross-stitch and weaving. The only cost to families would be postage. The organization has gathered over 9,000 volunteers in 42 countries. Their website is looseendsproject.org.

It will be a fun day of art, stitching and food.


The supplies for The Blue Bead are in! See Caren if you don't already have your kit. Prices vary depending on how much you ordered.
